UNION CITY BOROUGH ERIE COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA ORDINANCE NO. 1137

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION CITY, COUNTY OF ERIE, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, REPEALING ORDINANCE 1049 AND ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO, GENERALLY KNOWN AS THE PARKING ORDINANCE, PROVIDING DEFINITIONS RELATED TO PARKING; PROVIDING PROPER METHOD OF VEHICLE PARKING; PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITED METHODS OF PARKING; PROVIDING THE PROHIBITION ON OBSTRUCTING TRAFFIC; PROVIDING FOR THE PROHIBITION ON PARKING IN ALLEYS; PROVIDING FOR THE PROHIBITION ON PARKING NEAR HAZARDOUS OR CONGESTED LOCATION; DESIGNATING CURB LOADING ZONES; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS RELATED TO TAXICABS; PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITIONS ON UNATTENDED VEHICLES; PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITIONS ON PARKING LOCATIONS PURSUANT TO ADOPTED SCHEDULES; PROVIDING FOR THE A PARKING SIGNS REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING PROCEDURES RELATED TO PARKING ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL PARKING EXEMPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, REPEALER AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Borough Code, at 8 Pa.C.S. §1202(31), provides that the Union City Borough (the "Borough") is authorized to regulate the parking of motor vehicles within its jurisdictional area; and

WHEREAS, on or about March 22, 2005 the Borough adopted Ordinance No. 1049, colloquially known as the Union City Borough Parking Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough amended Ordinance No. 1049 through adoption of Ordinance Amendments on August 9, 2005, August 12, 2008, January 13, 2009, December 13, 2011, October 13, 2015, October 24, 2017, November 14, 2017, May 8, 2018, January 8, 2019, and March 26, 2019 (the "Amendments"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to repeal the Ordinance No. 1049 and its Amendments and adopt this Ordinance in order to provide clarity to the Borough's citizens on the existing parking regulations of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds that the adoption of a new Parking Ordinance will be in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, on this 8th day of June 2021, **BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Union City, Erie County, Pennsylvania as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals listed above are incorporated as if more fully set forth herein.
- 2. <u>Repeal of Ordinance 1049 and Amendments.</u> Borough Ordinance No. 1049, known as the Parking Ordinance, and the Amendments are hereby repealed, in their entireties.
- 3. <u>Title.</u> This Ordinance may be cited as the "Union City Borough Parking Ordinance."
- 4. <u>Definitions.</u> The following words and phrases when used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them as set forth herein:
- a) <u>Borough</u>. The Borough of Union City, Erie County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and its governing body, the Union City Borough Council.

b) Crosswalk.

- That part of a roadway at an intersection included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs.
- 2) Any portion of a roadway at an intersections or elsewhere distinctly indicated for a pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the road surface.
- c) <u>Curb Loading Zone</u>. A designated space adjacent to a curb reserved for the exclusive use of vehicles during the loading or unloading of passengers or materials.
 - d) <u>Driver.</u> Every person who drivers or is in physical control of a vehicle.
- e) <u>Highway</u>. The entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof if open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.
- f) Motor Vehicle. Every vehicle which is self-propelled, except one propelled solely by physical human power.

g) Park, Parked, or Parking.

 When permitted, the temporary storing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, off the roadway or along the roadway in a designated space, but not at any time between the curb or edge of the street and the sidewalk or within the right-of-way.

- 2) When prohibited, the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading materials or passengers.
- h) <u>Parking Enforcement Officer</u>. Every police officer commissioned by the Borough, including the Chief of Police, and the Borough Streets Supervisor.
- i) <u>Person</u>. Every natural person, firm, partnership, unincorporated association, corporation, limited partnership, limited liability partnership, limited liability company, business trust, or similar business entity.
- j) <u>Police Officer</u>. A natural person authorized by law to make arrests and issue citations for violations of law, as well as enforcement of the laws of the Borough and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- k) <u>Private Road or Driveway</u>. Every way or place in private ownership and used for vehicular travel by the owner and those having express or implied person by the owner, but not for use by the public.
- l) <u>Railroad</u>. A carrier of persons or property upon cars or train cars, other than street cars, operated upon stationary rails.
- m) Road or Roadway. That portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the berm or shoulder.
- n) <u>Sidewalk</u>. That portion of a street between the curb lines, or the lateral lines of a roadway, and the adjacent property lines, intended for use or foot-travel by pedestrians.
- o) <u>Stand or Standing</u>. The halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except monetarily for the purposes of and while actively engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.
- p) Stop, Stopped or Stopping. Any halting, even momentarily, of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control device.
 - q) Street. A highway established and ordained by the Borough as a public road.
- r) <u>Vehicle</u>. Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, excepting devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.
- 5. <u>Official Time Standard.</u> Whenever certain hours are named therein, they shall be in Eastern Standard Time, including Daylight Savings Time, as is currently utilized in the Borough.

6. Method of Parking.

- a) Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a roadway where adjacent curbs are located shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels of such vehicle parallel to and within six (6) inches of the adjacent right-hand curb.
- b) Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a roadway or berm adjacent to a roadway shall be so stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels of such vehicle parallel to and with the right-hand edge of said roadway or berm.

7. Stopping, Standing or Parking Prohibited.

- a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other vehicles or traffic, or in compliance with law, compliance with the directions of a political officer, or compliance with an official traffic control device, no person shall:
 - 1) Stop, stand, or park a vehicle:
 - i. On the roadway side of any vehicle standing, stopped, or parked, at the edge of the curb or a street;
 - ii. On a sidewalk;
 - iii. Within an intersection;
 - iv. On a crosswalk;
 - v. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic or potentially cause a hazard to vehicular travel in the Borough;
 - vi. Upon a bridge or any other elevated structure on a highway or street;
 - vii. Upon any railroad tracks or any railroad crossing;
 - viii. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping, standing or parking; or
 - ix. Between the curb of a street and the sidewalk or within the right-of-way.
 - 2) Stop, stand, or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger or passengers:
 - i. In front of a public or private driveway;
 - ii. Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
 - iii. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;

- iv. Within 20 feet upon the approach to any traffic control device located above or on the side of a roadway; or
 - v. At any place where official traffic control devices or signs prohibit parking.
- 3) Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose of loading or unloading materials of passengers:
 - i. Within fifty feet of the nearest railroad crossing or railroad tracks; or
 - ii. At any place where official traffic control devices or signs prohibit parking.
- b) No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under their control into any such prohibited area or away from a curb at such a distance that is unlawful, hazardous, or that obstructs other vehicles or traffic.
- 8) <u>Obstruction of Traffic.</u> No person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicle upon a street in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than 10 feet of width of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic.
- 9) No Parking in Alleys. No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle within an alley in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than 10 feet of width of the roadway for the free movement of vehicular traffic. No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle within an alley in such a position as to block a driveway entrance to any abutting property.
- 10) <u>Prohibition on Parking for Certain Purposes</u>. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of:
 - a) Displaying such vehicle for sale; or
- b) Washing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle except such repairs necessitated by an emergency.
 - 11. Prohibition on Parking in Hazardous or Dangerous Conditions.
- a) The Borough Manager, in consultation with the Borough Council and Chief of Police, is hereby authorized to determine and designate, by utilizing proper signage, places or areas not exceeding 100 feet in length where the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles would create an especially hazardous condition or would cause traffic congestion.
- b) When the Borough Manager erects official signs at the places designated as hazardous or congested, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle in those locations.

12. <u>Designation of Curb Loading Zones.</u>

- a) The Borough may only designate curb loading zones, or place signage at any curb loading zone, after receipt of a complete permit application, the payment of any applicable fee(s), and the approval of the Chief of Police, the Borough Fire Chief, and the Borough Street Supervisor. The permit application shall, at a minimum, include a description of the reasons for the request for a curb loading zone, the identification of where the two (2) curb loading signs will be installed, the manner of installation of the signs, and other information as may be required by the Borough. Applicable fee(s) shall include a permit fee, an annual service fee, and a fee covering the costs of the necessary signage and installation of the same, if any. The permit applicant shall be responsible for the payment of the actual cost of repair and/or replacement of any signs and the costs of the installation of the same, as may be necessary. Permit applications shall not be granted if the Borough determines that such a request constitutes a hazard, will create congestion, or is a risk to the public safety and welfare of Borough citizens. Each permit shall expire after one (1) year and must be renewed by the applicant on an annual basis.
- b) No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle for any purpose or length of time, other than for the expeditious loading and unloading of materials, in any location marked as a curb loading zone during hours when the provisions applicable to such curb loading zone is in effect. In no case shall a person stop, stand, or park for loading and unloading of materials for a period in excess of sixty (60) minutes.

13. <u>Taxicabs.</u>

- a) The operator of a taxicab or ride-sharing vehicle shall not stop, stand, or park such vehicle upon any street at any place other than a designated taxicab stand. The provisions shall not prevent the operator of a taxicab or ride-sharing vehicle from temporarily stopping in accordance with other stopping or parking regulations at any place for the purpose of and while actually engaged in the expeditious loading or unloading of passengers.
- b) The Borough shall designate appropriate areas and location, from time-to-time, throughout the municipality for stands to be used by taxicab and ride-sharing drivers, at the Borough's sole discretion.
- c) No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle, other than a taxicab or designated ride-sharing vehicle, in when such a stop or stand has been officially designated and appropriately signed, except that the driver of a passenger vehicle may temporarily stop, stand, or park therein for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading passengers when such stopping, standing, or parking does not interfere with any taxicab waiting to enter or about to enter such taxicab stand.
- 14. <u>Unattended Vehicles.</u> No person shall leave a vehicle unattended while the motor of such vehicle is still running; and no vehicle shall be left without a driver on any hill or incline unless the vehicle is properly secured against further movement.

15. Prohibited Parking on Certain Streets.

- a) The provisions of this section prohibiting the stopping, standing, or parking of a vehicle shall apply at all times or at those times herein specified or as indicated on official signs except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other vehicles or traffic or in compliance with the direction of a police officer or official traffic-control devices.
- b) The provisions of this section imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person from the duty to observe other and more restrictive provisions prohibiting or limiting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles in specified places at specified times.
- c) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, not person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule I, attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance.
- d) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle between the hours specified in Schedule II, attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance, or upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in said Schedule II.
- e) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, parking will be prohibited on alternate sides of the streets on alternate days of the week, on the streets or parts of streets designated in Schedule III, attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance. Such signs will specific that parking is prohibited on every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday on one side of the street and is prohibited every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday on the opposite side of the street. The parking prohibition for such streets shall not be in effect from 9:00 P.M. through 4:00 A.M. of each day.
- f) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle on any streets or parts of streets in violation of the regulations as set forth in Schedule IV attached to and made a part of this Ordinance.
- g) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle from 12:01 A.M. on November 15 of each year through 11:59 P.M. on April 15 of each year on any streets or parts of streets described in Schedule V, attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance.
- h) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle from 12:01 A.M. on November 15 of each year through 11:59 P.M. on April 15 of each year for a period of time and on any streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VI, attached hereto and made a part of this Ordinance.
- i) Specified parking restrictions imposed by this Ordinance may be temporarily lifted upon application of a Borough community-related organization, and upon the formal approval by the Borough Council, as long as the lifting of such restrictions are limited to one-side of each street and limited to a reasonable number of days. The Borough Council shall, in its discretion, approve such requests by Resolution at a properly advertised public meeting.

- j) As set forth in this Ordinance or when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person, other than an individual with disability or severely disabled veteran, whose vehicle has a state-issued disability parking placard, or an individual or severely disabled veteran for whom a parking spot has been reserved pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle in such designated spots as more fully described in Schedule VII.
- 16. <u>Parking Signs Required.</u> When, by this Ordinance or any other Borough Ordinance, a parking time limit is imposed or parking is prohibited on designated streets, it shall be the duty of the Borough Manager, in consultation with the Chief of Police, to direct the placement and erection of appropriate signs giving notice thereof.

17. Penalties.

- a) The name on the registration of a vehicle, which is illegally stopped, standing, or parked, shall be considered *prima facie* evidence that such person was in control of the vehicle at the time of such stopping, standing, or parking.
- b) Any person accused of a violation of found to be in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense and may settle and compromise the claim against them for (i) such illegal stopping, standing, or parking by paying to the Borough the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) within twenty-four (24) hours of the time such alleged offense was committed or the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) after 24 hours or the next business day has passed after the time such alleged offense was committed; and (ii) if illegally parked in a handicapped zone, a fine of two hundred dollars (\$200.00). A receipt shall be issued for all monies so received and said monies shall be turned over monthly to the Borough Treasurer to be used in the manner provided for the disposition of fines for traffic violations.
- c) Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance or aiding, abetting, or assisting in the violation of said provisions, shall upon conviction before the Magisterial District Judge with jurisdiction, be subjected to a fine of not less than twice the amount required to settle the claim established by this Ordinance in Section 17(b) above and as stated on the parking ticket, nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), together with the costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, said convicted person may undergo imprisonment in the Erie County prison for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days.
- d) An illegally parked vehicle may be towed by the Borough Police Department, or the Borough Street Supervisor, or their designee, at the expense of the owner, upon the second (2) violation of this Ordinance within seventy-two (72) hours, such violations occurring on the same street.

18. <u>Procedure for Parking Enforcement Officers.</u>

a) The Borough shall provide ticket books to the Borough's Parking Enforcement Officers, which include parking ticket forms for notifying alleged violators of the nature of the violation of this Ordinance. Said books shall include serially numbered sets of tickets and shall be in a format established by the Chief of Police in consultation with the Borough Street Supervisor.

- b) The Chief of Police will be responsible for the issuance of such ticket books to Parking Enforcement Officers and shall maintain a record showing the disposition of each serially numbered ticket.
- c) Every Parking Enforcement Officer upon issuing a ticket to an alleged violator of this Ordinance shall deposit a copy of the ticket with the Chief of Police.
- d) Whenever ay motor vehicle without a driver is found parked or stopped in violation of the restrictions imposed by this Ordinance, the Parking Enforcement Officer finding such vehicle shall take its registration number and any other information which may identify the vehicle or its owner or user, and shall conspicuously affix to such vehicle a parking ticket for the driver to answer the charge against them within twenty-four (24) hours.
- e) Parking Enforcement Officers shall wait a period of twenty-four (24) hours prior to issuing a second parking ticket for a motor vehicle that is found parked or stopped in violation of the restrictions imposed by this Ordinance.
- f) If a violator of the restrictions on stopping, standing, or parking imposed by this Ordinance does not appear in response to a parking ticket affixed to such vehicle within twenty-four (24) hours, the Chief of Police shall send a letter to the owner of the vehicle to which the parking citation was affixed a letter informing them of the violation and warning them that in the event such a letter or citation is disregarded for a period of five (5) days from the date of the letter, a citation charging the alleged violation of this Ordinance will be filed with the Magisterial District Judge having jurisdiction.
- Ordinance, a special parking exemption may be granted by the Borough for a temporary period of time. A person requesting a special parking exemption shall fill out a "Special Parking Exemption" form available at the Borough Police Department. All exemption requests shall be filed with the Borough Police Department at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the requested exemption period. The Chief of Police, or their designee, shall make the determination if a special parking exemption will be granted. A special parking exemption may not exceed a twelve (12) hour period. An exemption shall not be granted if it is determined that the exemption will cause a hazard or risk to the public safety and general welfare of the Borough, its residents and visitors. An exemption request shall include, but not be limited to, a description of the area that the special parking exemption would apply, the contact information for the applicant, a narrative of the reason for the exemption, a description of the vehicles that would use the area benefitted by the special parking exemption, and any other information required by the Borough.

20. Disability Parking.

a) The Borough Council may, at the request of an individual with a disability, or a severely disabled veteran, erect a sign or signs indicating that a specific parking spot is reserved for that disabled person or severely disabled veteran, and that no parking is allowed there by others. The sign or signs shall indicate that any unauthorized person parking in the designated space shall be subject to a fine and may be towed in accordance with Section 17 of this

Ordinance. The absence of a sign stating the penalty amount shall not preclude the enforcement of this subsection.

- b) A vehicle may only be towed under this provision if the parking space is posted with a sign indicating that vehicles in violation of this section may be towed. The Borough Council may limit access to a parking spot designated under this subsection to a specific vehicle, license plate, or other method of designation.
- c) The Borough Council may permit a designated disabled parking spot for the pick-up and drop-off of a specific disabled individual.
- d) An applicant for a disability parking spot must submit a fully completed application to the Borough Manager The application shall include the name, contact information, desired location of spot, proof of disability, and an initial application fee of one hundred dollars (\$100). Additionally, the Borough may determine that an annual renewal fee is appropriate as established by Resolution of the Borough Council.
- 21. <u>Schedules of Designated Streets</u>. The Borough Council hereby attaches Schedule I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII to this Ordinance and incorporates the same herein. The Borough Council reserves the right to attach additional Schedules at a later date and may revise any Schedule through Resolution duly adopted at a public meeting.
- 22. <u>Repealer</u>. Any Ordinances, rules, or resolutions, or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
- 23. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any sentence clause, section, or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.
- 24. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its proper execution by the Borough Mayor.

Permits shall be available for Borough residents (proof of residency will be required) and only for legally registered vehicles. Drivers must submit their drivers' license, proof of insurance, inspection, and registration in order to receive a permit for Municipal Lot One.

Permitted vehicles must be moved at least once per week. No overnight parking is permitted from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. every day of the week during and including the period from the 15th of November through the 15th of April. All other parking in Municipal Lot One is limited to 4 hours in duration in designated areas. All vehicles parking in Municipal Lot One shall park with the front pulled into the parking space. Backing into a parking space is not permitted. Owners will only be permitted to park two (2) vehicles per drivers' license in Municipal Lot One.

SCHEDULE IV (CONTINUED)

In accordance with Section 15(f), special parking regulations shall be as follows:

Municipal Lot Two

Located between Market Street and French Creek and North Main Street and the property belonging to the Union City Chair and other private property shall have overnight parking by permit in the spaces located on the east side of the parking lot. Annual permits are available from the Borough Manager at a cost to be determined, from time-to-time, by Resolution of the Borough Council. Permits shall be available for Borough residents (proof of residency will be required) and only for legally registered vehicles. Drivers must submit their drivers' license, proof of insurance, inspection, and registration in order to receive a permit for Municipal Lot Two.

Permitted vehicles must be moved at least once per week. No overnight parking is permitted for recreational vehicles. No overnight parking is permitted from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. every day of the week during and including the period from the 15th of November through the 15th of April. All other parking in Municipal Lot Two is limited to 4 hours in duration in designated areas. All vehicles parking in Municipal Lot Two shall park with the front pulled into the parking space. Backing into a parking space is not permitted. Owners will only be permitted to park two (2) vehicles per drivers' license in Municipal Lot Two.

Municipal Lot Three

Annual permits are available from the Borough Manager at a cost to be determined, from time-to-time, by Resolution of the Borough Council. Permits shall be available for Borough residents (proof of residency will be required) and only for legally registered vehicles. Drivers must submit their drivers' license, proof of insurance, inspection, and registration in order to receive a permit for Municipal Lot Three.

Permitted vehicles must be moved at least once per week. No overnight parking is permitted for recreational vehicles. No overnight parking is permitted from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. every day of the week during and including the period from the 15th of November through the 15th of April. All other parking in Municipal Lot Three is limited to 4 hours in duration in designated areas. All vehicles parking in Municipal Lot Two shall park with the front pulled into the parking space. Backing into a parking space is not permitted. Owners will only be permitted to park two (2) vehicles per drivers' license in Municipal Lot Three.
